Letter from our President & CEO



I'm proud of CET's nearly 50-year track record of innovating, implementing, and scaling the environmental solutions that communities need to thrive.

Here's what I love about CET: we're boots-on-the-ground doers. Our 100 staff are in people's homes and businesses every day. We're helping to insulate buildings, to convert them off fossil fuels, to set up food waste diversion programs. We're implementing solutions that stop putting carbon into the atmosphere.

And it's seeing what our team is capable of that makes me believe we can win at the climate crisis. But here's what frustrates me—CET's making a fraction of the impact that we could IF it weren't for certain constraints. Constraints on innovation and constraints on giving people the full support they need to wade through the chaos of climate action.

We are proud to be a nonprofit that wins competitive bids and can operate on contracted revenue alone, but it leaves so much of our vision and impact on the table. As the urgency of our climate crisis grows, so does my impatience. My team is determined to scale CET at a pace that's worthy of this moment. That is why we use every dollar you and others donate to CET and put it to use right away to fill the gap in what our contracts will fund. Thanks to your help, we reached more people and helped them go further in their decarbonization journeys.

In this report, you will see that just 3% of our funding comes from donations. In the coming year, we aim to inspire you and many others to stand in support of CET's impactful and pragmatic work. One way to earn your trust is to share the impact of your giving, something we've not done well enough. Let this impact report be the first of many opportunities we will share how you made a difference for individuals, small and big businesses, and the whole planet.

Replicating and Scaling Our Model
Last year, we leveraged our awardwinning RecyclingWorks waste
programs (operated under the Mass
Department of Environmental
Protection) and expanded them
across the region to reach many
more communities. Now CET is

country to share our knowledge and
resources.

Building Workforce Capacity

Designed and ran Weatherization Boot Camp to train Connecticut's insulation contractors in building science, installation techniques, and customer service, and cultural competency.

Driving Commercial Energy

Responsible for 75% of all commercial weatherization jobs that went through the Mass Save program in 2022.

Launched the Commonwealth's first Inclusive Utility Investments program with the Ipswich Electric Light Department. We're betting on this to rapidly accelerate the adoption of clean energy solutions by making them affordable and accessible to all.




